Investment Objective

To provide unit holders with capital growth opportunities through investment in securities in the Malaysian equity market.

Potential Investor

ASN Equity Malaysia is suitable for:

- Investors with high risk tolerance;
- Investors with a preference for capital appreciation; and/or

MARKET REVIEW

As at end August 2026, the fund reported an annualised return of 20.02%, over a 3-year basis, outperforming its benchmark’s 6.10% return.

Global markets continued their positive momentum in August, with the FTSE All-World Index gaining 2.78%. Year-to-date, global markets have seen an overall positive performance of 14.59%. Middle East & Africa was the best performing region in August, with the FTSE Middle East & Africa Index rising 5.37%. The highest performing country index for the month was the FTSE South Africa Index, rose 10.67%. Conversely, the worst performing country index was the FTSE Philippines Index, finishing the month down at -6.45%. Malaysia’s KLCI continued climbing for the second consecutive month, edging up 0.98 index points to register a marginal 0.06% gain. Within the size segments of the FTSE Bursa Malaysia EMAS Index, FTSE Bursa Malaysia Small Cap Index was the best performer in the FTSE Bursa Malaysia Index Series, rising 2.62% for the month, overshadowing the poor performance of FTSE Bursa Malaysia Small Mid 70 Index of -0.49%. The FTSE Bursa Malaysia EMAS Index gained 0.10%. The top ten constituents of the FTSE Bursa Malaysia KLCI account for 67.06% of the index, as compared to 46.72% for FTSE Bursa Malaysia EMAS Index and 19.24% for the FTSE Bursa Malaysia Small Cap Index. Utilities was the best performing sector in the FTSE Bursa Malaysia KLCI Index, registering 12.48% with Real Estate being the second-best performer at 6.86%. Conversely, Materials was the worst performing sector followed by Communication Services, at -3.45% and -2.84% respectively. With an index weighting of 42.67% and 6 constituents, Financials is the largest industry in the FTSE Bursa Malaysia KLCI. This compares to a weight of 30.75% and 10 constituents in the FTSE Bursa Malaysia EMAS Index. Industrial Goods and Services is the largest industry in the FTSE Bursa Malaysia Small Cap with an index weighting of 16.05% and 32 constituents.

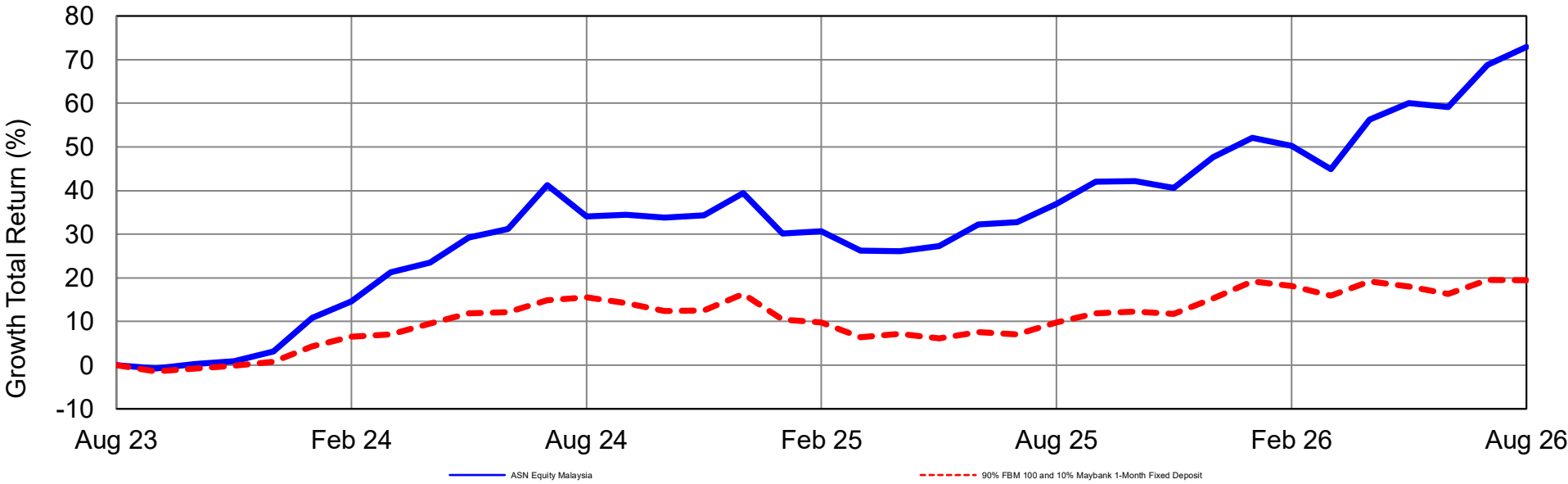

The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six months. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
